Evaluating Corrosion & Sedimentation in an Active Wastewater Interceptor to Improve Operations and Identify Optimum Rehabilitation

The City of Fort Worth has over 19 miles of parallel 90 to 96-inch wastewater interceptors that transport flows to the Village Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant. These concrete pipe interceptors were installed in 1963 and 1977 and are critical in transporting wastewater flows for a majority of the Fort Worth service area. The City conducted a visual inspection of the interceptors which identified corrosion problems. That qualitative, visual inspection prompted the City to conduct a quantitative inspection to measure and evaluate the interceptor's structural and operational condition.

For this inspection a remotely operated robot was selected and utilized for forensic measurements of corrosion by laser scanning, sedimentation measurements by sonar scans, visual inspection by closed circuit television, and H₂S gas profiling. The interceptor measurements taken allows for the structural evaluation and life expectancy determination of the interceptors. The sediment measurements show available pipe capacity and areas for cleaning activity. The H₂S profiling and H₂SWIN



modeling along with the structural evaluations is used to determine the life expectancy of the interceptor at various locations.

The detailed inspection identified that sedimentation and corrosion varied significantly. Additional interceptor system information was reviewed along with system operational data to understand the interceptor system responses. Examples of how the interceptor system design, hydraulics and operations affect corrosion, sedimentation and odors will be presented. Variances in how concrete interceptors was constructed in the 60's and 70's and their response to corrosion was observed and evaluated.

The presentation will discuss how the reliability of the interceptors and remain useful life was evaluated by calculating the structural condition of the pipe in consideration of the measured corrosion, pipe manufacturing, changes in surface conditions, embedment and may other structural and operational factors.

The presentation will also include rehabilitation alternatives and schedules for of the interceptors along with the costs, operational impacts and benefits to the system. The alternatives evaluated include sliplining, cure-in-place, replacement, coatings, lining and chemicals.

Ms. Rafalko has over 15 years of environmental engineering experience specializing in project management of wastewater projects. She holds a Bachelors of Science in Civil Engineering from the University of Texas at Arlington. She is a Senior Professional Engineer for the City of Fort Worth Water Department.
