

Preference shall be given to those:


- Members of WEAT-NTS or dependents of WEAT-NTS members

# May Meeting Recap



North Texas WEAT members came together for our second facility tour in May at the Fort Worth Biosolids Processing Facility. The \$59 million project has provided a long-term and sustainable solution by replacing the existing belt filter presses/lime stabilization process with a centrifuge dewatering and drum drying process that has elevated the Village Creek WRF biosolids from a Class "AB" standing to a Class "A" pelletized biosolids product. Steve Nutter presented on the history of solids management for the City of Fort Worth and the path to the pelletized product. Attendees first gathered at the Texas Star for lunch and then travelled to the facility to see it in action.







On April 22nd, members of WEAT particiapted in the TRWD Trash Bash to help remove litter throughout the community and local waterways.
