Speaker

Webster Mangham

Webster has a Master Degree in Geography from the University of North Texas. He has worked for TRA's Environmental Planning and Management Division for 3 years.

The Trinity River, the 512-mile-long river that stretches from north of the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex to Galveston Bay, and its natural resources are important assets to Texas. Providing drinking water for more than 8.9 million residents, the river and its 1,983 miles of major tributaries drain an area of more than 11.5 million acres.

In September 2006, Governor Rick Perry announced the Trinity River Basin Environmental Restoration Initiative. As part of that initiative, A&M's Institute of Renewable Natural Resources (IRNR) worked with the Trinity River Authority (TRA), the Trinity Basin Conservation Foundation, and other agencies to develop a user-friendly Trinity River Internet Mapping System (TRIMS). The work was funded by a Clean Rivers Program grant from TCEQ.

TRIMS gives users access to mapping data, remote sensing data, low-elevation aerial photographs, and other information that helps in the planning of the Trinity restoration. It pulls together multiple databases with detailed information on water quality, hydrology, floodplain management, wetland restoration, bottomland hardwood establishment, and wildlife habitat management.

The presentation will describe the development and capabilities of TRIMS and demonstrate its application to environmental issues.

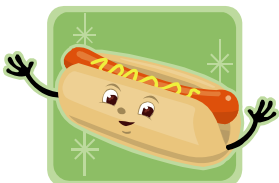
