## CH2M Hill Announces Three New Employees

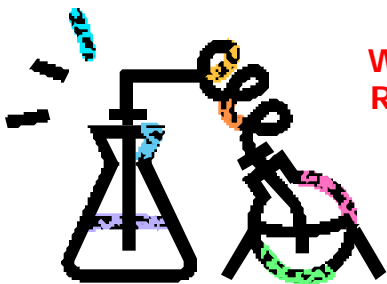
CH2M HILL is proud to announce the addition of three employees to our Dallas office:
