

About the Competition:

The annual Texas River Cleanup Challenge, hosted by WEAT, has just started its second year. The following awards are presented at the Texas Water Awards Breakfast: Most Interesting Trash, Best Trashy Photo, Best Trashy Site, and Best Section Spirit. The competition takes place May – March each year, with local WEAT sections sponsoring and participating in river cleanup events. The mission is to promote family-oriented awareness of environmental stewardship and interaction between sections.

WEAT NTS Involvement:

As part of the Texas River Cleanup Challenge, the North Texas Section (WEAT-NTS) organized its second annual Redeem the Stream river cleanup event and participated at TRWD's Trinity River Trash Bash in Fort Worth. At the Trinity Trash Bash hosted by TRWD September 17, 2016 WEAT-



NTS officers, members, families, and spouses picked up trash along the Trinity River. This is the second year WEAT-NTS hosted Redeem the Stream, a cleanup of the Trinity River in Dallas near Fishing Hole Lake on November 12, 2016. In partnership with CP&Y and Groundwork Dallas, the WEAT-NTS Re-

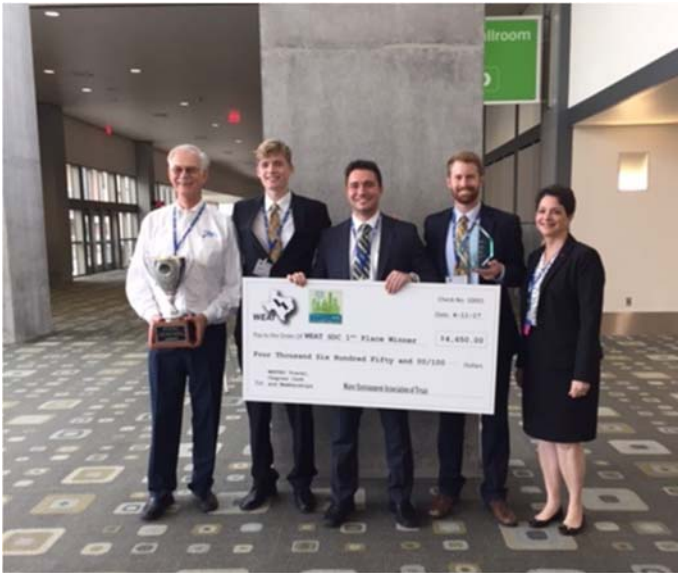

TEXAS WATER 2017

North Texas Section Represents at Texas Water Operations Challenge by Heather Wootton

For another year in a row, WEAT Operations Challenge raised the bar and hosted its largest competition year ever with 11 teams competing, seven teams made up of Texas operations employees and four teams visiting from Arizona, California, Colorado, and Louisiana.

The Texas teams were primarily from WEAT-NTS and included the Dallas Water Utilities AquaTechs, Dallas Water Utilities Central Snappers, Trinity River Authority CReWSers, Trinity River Authority Waste Warriors, North Texas Municipal Water District South Mesquite Rangers, North Richland Hills POOseidons, and Austin Bat City. Teams battled it out at the 29th Annual Operations Challenge competition. The Texas teams were competing for spots for the national competition held at WEFTEC in Chicago this September.

Operations Challenge helps to recognize excellence and professionalism in wastewater treatment, operations, maintenance, laboratory, safety, and collection systems personnel. This competition is a five event competition that pits teams of four against each other to race for the fastest time. The events are timed and penalties can be added for mistakes or shortcuts during the runs. The events include: The Laboratory Event, where teams simulate completing an alkalinity analysis, the Process Control Event, which is a pencil and paper test, The Maintenance Event, where teams race to complete maintenance on a Godwin pump, the Collections Event, a simulation of repairing an in-service pipe, and the Safety Event, where teams recover a downed colleague from a confined space area.

The individual event winners are listed in the table on the following page.

The final rankings are calculated based on the amount of time it takes for each team to complete the five events. The overall first, second and third place are called out below.
