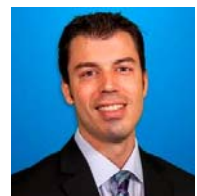
Dear WEAT-NTS Members:

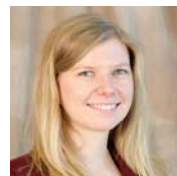

# OPERATIONS CHALLENGE

Operations Challenge 30 Years and Going Strong!

For another year in a row, WEAT Operations Challenge raised the bar and hosted its largest competition year ever with 13 teams competing, nine teams made up of Texas operations employees and four teams visiting from Arizona, California, Colorado, and Louisiana.

Six teams represented the North Texas Section including the Dallas Water Utilities AquaTechs, Dallas Water Utilities Central Snappers, Trinity River Authority CREWSers, Trinity River Authority Waste Warriors, North Texas Municipal Water District South Mesquite Rangers, and the North Richland Hills POOseidons. Teams battled it out at the 30<sup>th</sup> Annual Operations Challenge competition.

The final rankings are calculated based on the amount of time it takes for each team to complete the five events. The overall first, second and third place are called out below. The WEAT NTS TRA CREWSers walked away with the first overall award.

The prestigious David Barber Competitive Spirit Award is awarded to the competitor with the best spirit and drive, and represents one of the highest honors a competitor can receive. This year the teams' selected Steve Price from the Trinity River Authority to receive this award. This award was created in 2008 in memory of the late David Barber, a longtime member of the Dillo Xpress. Judy Barber, wife of David, and Barbie Barber, sister of David, was on hand to give this award out to Steve. The David Barber Competitive Spirit Award is graciously sponsored by Dunaway.

This year WEAT is able to sponsor six teams to attend the national conference at WEFTEC in New Orleans, Louisiana all of which come from WEAT NTS. These teams include the : DWU Aqua Techs, DWU Central Snappers, NRH Poosidons, NTMWD South Mesquite Rangers, TRA CREWSers, and TRA Waste Warriors.

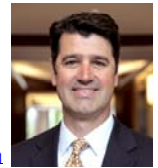
# SCHOLARSHIP UPDATES

# WEAT Texas River Cleanup Challenge Awards

The Texas River Cleanup Challenge is in its 3rd year now! This is a friendly competition between the Water Environment Association of Texas (WEAT) Sections (joint sections and student chapters included) while providing a positive impact locally. It is part of a Texas-wide effort to keep local waterways clean while promoting environmental awareness and stewardship. The competition's primary goal is to facilitate involvement and connection between WEAT Sections and their communities, as well as encourage communication and collaboration among sections. Cleanup challenge events are exciting opportunities to promote local environmental awareness, jump-start activities in your local WEAT section, and have fun while enhancing your local community. Three sections participated in this year's challenge, which include the sections of North Texas, Central Texas, and Southeast Section.

The North Texas Section participated in the city-wide *Trinity River Trash Bash* in Fort Worth hosted by Tarrant Regional Water District and hosted its own 3<sup>rd</sup> annual *Redeem the Stream* cleanup along the Trinity River in Dallas. The Dallas River cleanup partnered with GroundWork Dallas to continue a rehab effort of a floodplain area. Between the two events, WEAT-NTS volunteers collected a whopping 125 bags of trash! In one of their events, their volunteers collected 2580 lbs. of trash and 3000 lbs. of debris rendering a grand total of 5580 lbs.! Volunteers were given shirts stating Challenge Accepted and featured the *Redeem the Stream* mascot, Trinity the Crab. To keep things interesting, the section also provided canoes for volunteers who had the gumption to take on the Challenge from the water. Their most interesting trash entries include a shopping cart buried in the river bottom and an ammo box. Funny enough, they also found trash bins which the volunteers reused to collect trash!



The Central Texas Section promoted "Keep Austin Clean" by hosting their second annual *Ladybird Lake Kayak Cleanup* in conjunction with the local TAWWA chapter. To cover more ground, they also held another event called "Adopt-A-Creek" in partnership with Engineers without Borders. This collaboration is new and there's nothing like stomping around in the mud to build new friendships. To keep it creative, the volunteers chose kayaking for grabbing trash from not only the river banks but from the depths below the water surface. Cleaning up trash and working on rowing skills makes for a hungry group! All volunteers were provided with kayaks, cleaning supplies and a lovely lunch at a Tex Mex joint nearby. All volunteers wore bright garish attire in keeping up with their theme "Keeping things in Austin WEIRD and Clean"! Between the two events, they collected over 30 bags of trash. Their description of the most interesting trash "The great transmitter" got the attention of all our judges and they truly embodied the spirit of keeping things WEIRD in Austin!

The Southeast Section joined forces with the young professional section of TAWWA to host a trash cleanup at John P McGovern Cascade along Buffalo Bayou in Houston. The cleanup event was originally scheduled for the month of October 2017 but was cancelled due to heavy rains. This was rescheduled for flood damage mitigation in the month of November. Hurricane Harvey brought large amounts of silt to the City and volunteers helped move silt from around all trees in the park. This event may not directly relate to a conventional trash cleanup challenge but we would still like to make an honorable mention here for their enthusiasm in helping their community recover from the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey.

The award for "Trashiest Section" goes to the North Texas Section that collected over 125 bags of trash. The award for the "Most Interesting Trash" goes to the "The Great Transmitter" – The Central Texas Section. The award for the "Best Section Spirit" also goes to The Central Texas Section.
